Psalms is a beloved prayer book of the Bible, and the JULY Praying the Psalms subjects of an infinite number of books.

What guidance does the Psalms offer?

INTRODUCTION

Beginning in Psalms Chapter 1, we find guidance to meditate on God, "Blessed is the one ... whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on (God's) law day and night." How, then, shall we pray? What are the words we use to talk to God? The Psalms teach us guidance.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer said that, "Even those Psalms that do not address God a single time may be called prayers, for they serve to submerge us in God's purpose and will." The Psalms is like our prayer book because it addresses many emotions and needs. God gave the Psalms to all of us. David wrote many of the Psalms, filling each with praise, song and the desires of our hearts.

If the Psalms are our prayer book, how do we return these prayers to God? We know that specific words are not required to pray, but the Psalms do contain holy words for us to use. Below are examples of Psalms we can pray when we ask for help and to offer praise. We can pray the Psalms using one verse or even part of one. The Isalms guide our conversations with God.
